Hebrews 4:12-16

Lector A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews.

The word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing until it divides soul from spirit, joints from marrow; it is able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And before him no creature is hidden, but all are naked and laid bare to the eyes of the one to whom we must render an account. Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honor your father and mother.'" But Jesus said to them again, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." They were greatly astounded and said to one another, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible." Peter began to say to him, "Look, we have left everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first."



Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. 
Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him.

Music Notes

Adagio by **Henry G. Ley (1887-1962),** an English organist, composer and educator, is a beautifully crafted piece that showcases Ley's mastery of the organ. Known for its serene and contemplative character, this Adagio is a fine example of early 20th-century English organ music. The piece is marked by its lyrical melodies and rich harmonic textures, creating a meditative and introspective atmosphere. Ley's use of the organ's full range of colors and dynamics allows the performer to explore a wide emotional palette, making this work a favorite among organists.

Vox Ultima Crucis is a poignant anthem for unison choir and organ. Composed by **William Harris** (1883-1973), a prominent figure in English choral music, this piece is known for its expressive depth and spiritual resonance. The text, derived from a poem by John Lydgate, reflects on themes of redemption and the journey towards eternal life. The music is characterized by its lyrical melodies and rich harmonies, creating a contemplative and uplifting atmosphere. Harris's skillful use of the organ adds a majestic quality, enhancing the overall impact of the piece.

Alla Marcia by **Henry Coleman (1888-1965)** is a lively and spirited piece for organ, characterized by its march-like rhythm and bright, energetic melodies. Composed in the early 20th century, this piece reflects Coleman's ability to blend traditional forms with a fresh, modern touch. The work is structured to highlight the organ's dynamic range and versatility. A contemporary of both Henry Ley and William Harris, Coleman was an English organist and composer. His music reflects his deep commitment to the Anglican choral tradition and his skill in creating engaging and accessible pieces for worship and concert settings.
