

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

THE FIRST LESSON Job 42:1-6, 10-17

Lector A reading from the Book of Job.

Job answered the Lord: "I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted. 'Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?' Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know. 'Hear, and I will speak; I will question you, and you declare to me.' I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes." And the Lord restored the fortunes of Job when he had prayed for his friends; and the Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before. Then there came to him all his brothers and sisters and all who had known him before, and they ate bread with him in his house; they showed him sympathy and comforted him for all the evil that the Lord had brought upon him; and each of them gave him a piece of money and a gold ring. The Lord blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning; and he had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand donkeys. He also had seven sons and three daughters. He named the first Jemimah, the second Keziah, and the third Keren-happuch. In all the land there were no women so beautiful as Job's daughters; and their father gave them an inheritance along with their brothers. After this Job lived for one hundred and forty years, and saw his children, and his children's children, four generations. And Job died, old and full of days.

THE SECOND LESSON

Hebrews 7:23-28

Lector A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews.

The former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office; but Jesus holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues forever. Consequently he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them. For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect forever.


Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him.



Music Notes

Michael Bedford is Organist/Choirmaster Emeritus of St. John's Episcopal Church in Tulsa, Oklahoma. After 50 years in the church music business, and 25 of those years at St. John's Church, he is now retired. Currently he serves as President of the American Guild of Organists. In his spare time, he continues to compose and write mystery novels. Dr. Bedford is a widely published composer of choral music for children's, youth and adult choirs, as well as organ collections and handbell pieces.

His Antiphonal Praise for Handbells is a joyous piece which features a compositional technique that has been around for centuries. Traditionally there were two ensembles on opposite sides of a given space, and the music would be played alternatively and by both ensembles. In this case the "second ensemble" is played by fewer bells and softer.

Linda Lamb has been involved with handbells since 1992, as director, ringer, and composer. She is also a founding member of the Pax River Ringers, a community group in Southern Maryland. Her arrangements for handbells have been popular with Handbell Ensembles. Her arrangement of the hymn "O God beyond all praising" uses the famous melody written by Gustav Holst. The melody comes from his orchestral suite "The Planets," the "Jupiter" movement. The melody was subsequently set to the hymn text. The hymn is set in major and is joyous; however, Lamb's arrangement starts and finishes in the minor mode, giving the piece an interesting twist.

Gordon Jacob (1895 – 1984) was an English composer and teacher. He was a professor at the Royal College of Music in London from 1924 until his retirement in 1966. His anthem O Lord, I Will Praise Thee is based on Isaiah Chapter 12 and gives thanks and praise to God. The music, appropriately, is exuberant and features triumphal harmonies with the organ providing broad support of the choir. Of particular interest, the phrase "Sing unto the Lord" is repeated is repeated four *times* in choir unison; perhaps to drive home that message.

Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1958), arguably the most imaginative, prolific, and engaging British composer of the first half of the twentieth century, wrote so relatively few works for solo organ. Why was this? Other twentieth-century British composers (such as Matthias, Leighton, Wills, Jackson, and, especially, Howells) contributed to the organ's literature in major ways. Some say Vaughan Williams did not like the organ. It is more accurate to suggest he did not enjoy playing the organ.

Three Preludes Founded On Welsh Hymn Tunes was published in 1920 by Stainer & Bell. The second prelude of the set, Rhosymedre, was played at Vaughan Williams's funeral in 1958. Vaughan Williams first encountered these tunes when editing The English Hymnal (1906). The preludes are likely among the first works completed after his leaving the army in 1919. Hyfrydol makes a bit of an odd conclusion to the set: a very thick-textured setting of the tune above a constantly moving pedal part that romps over two octaves. (Notes by David Herman).
