The Tradition of Choral Evensong

Choral Evensong is one of the treasures of the Anglican tradition. It is a service sung evening prayer that combines music with readings from scripture and ancient prayers.

The service is one of the great legacies of the English Reformation. Its origins are in the ancient monastic—and before then, Jewish—tradition of marking the day with specific times of prayer. At the Reformation, there were eight monastic offices in existence, recurring every three hours or so during the day. When the Church of England severed ties with Rome, The Archbishop of Canterbury, Thomas Cranmer (1489-1556), condensed the traditional monastic offices into Morning and Evening Prayer, or Matins and Evensong (Cranmer combined the offices of Matins, Lauds, and Prime into Anglican Matins. Likewise, Vespers and Compline were consolidated to create Evensong. Thus, at Evensong, we sing *both* the Magnificat and Nunc dimittis canticles, or songs of praise). Since the English Reformation, most cathedrals in England (and many within the Anglican Communion) have maintained the tradition of singing the Daily Office of Matins and Evensong. In many Anglican or Episcopal parishes—such as Grace Church—reciting the Daily Office is often a regular discipline of clergy and laity alike.

In this rich liturgy, of which the psalms are the heart, we hear the Magnificat, Mary's song of acceptance of the will of God and faithful acquiescence to the knowledge that she would bear the Son of God, Jesus. We also hear the Nunc dimittis, Simeon's song of rejoicing after he first sees the child Jesus in the Temple. Both canticles are from the Gospel of Luke. We listen to Scripture, and we pray for the state of the world and the Church.

A rite for Evensong or Evening Prayer is available in *The Book of Common Prayer* (1979), found in the pews here at Grace Church; this rite, in traditional language, is the model for this evening's liturgy. The translation of the psalms sung by the choir is from the 1662 *Book of Common Prayer* of the Church of England (still the official prayer book) and is the work of Miles Coverdale (c. 1488-1569). Coverdale was responsible for the first English translation of the Bible. The poetry of his psalm translations is unparalleled in the ease with which it can be sung and set to music (notably, Anglican chant). While the language is archaic, it is colorful, memorable, and exquisitely beautiful.

Even though there is limited congregational participation at Choral Evensong, the congregation is indeed worshipping heartily with the choir, as the choir sings on behalf of the congregation. All are united in mind, body, and spirit in this lovely service. You are invited to join in singing where noted in the bulletin. All hymns are found in the blue *Hymnal 1982*, found in the pews.
