


# Welcome to Grace Episcopal Church

First Sunday of Advent December 1, 2024 – 10:30 am Choral Eucharist, Rite I



Today is the first Sunday in Advent. Advent (which means "coming") is the season of four weeks before Christmas. During this time, the church prepares for the coming of Christ—not only the birth of the baby Jesus at Bethlehem, but also the second coming. Advent is not a penitential season but rather a time of quiet, solemnity, and waiting. Our liturgy reflects this expectation. Purple vestments symbolize royalty and our hope for the heir of David. The tone of our liturgy is reflective—for example, instead of singing the Gloria in Excelsis we use the Trisagion, acknowledging God's power and asking for mercy.




#### THE COLLECT FOR PURITY

## THE SUMMARY OF THE LAW

Deacon The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Jesus said, "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." Then he told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."





All glory be to thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there, by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink ye all of this; for this is my Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me."

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, according to the institution of thy dearly beloved Son our Savior Jesus Christ, we, thy humble servants, do celebrate and make here before thy divine Majesty, with these thy holy gifts, which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; rendering unto thee most hearty thanks for the innumerable benefits procured unto us by the same.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us; and, of thy almighty goodness, vouchsafe to bless and sanctify, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, these thy gifts and creatures of bread and wine; that we, receiving them according to thy Son our Savior Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant that, by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we, and all thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.





#### THE INVITATION TO COMMUNION

BCP, p. 338

Celebrant The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the eucharist. Please come forward to the altar rail at the direction of the ushers.

A full communion is made with the bread alone, but if you choose to receive the wine, you may either drink from the cup, or you may offer your wafer to the person holding the chalice, who will dip the bread in the wine for you.

If you prefer a blessing, please cross your arms over your chest. Gluten free wafers are available; simply ask the priest. If you do not wish to receive communion at the altar, please let an usher know, and communion can be brought to you in your pew.

## **Music Notes**

Alec Rowley (1892 – 1958) was an English composer, organist, pianist, lecturer and writer on music. He composed a large number of works, mainly on a small scale and often of an educational nature though with some larger-scale orchestral and choral works (Wikipedia). His Benedictus starts softly, grows louder towards the middle of the piece and ends quietly.

Henry Ley (1887–1962) was an English organist, composer, and conductor known for his contributions to church music, particularly through his organ compositions and hymn arrangements. His setting of the well-loved Advent hymn "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus" is a beautiful example of his ability to blend traditional hymnody with expressive harmonies and an engaging choral texture.

The hymn itself, written by Charles Wesley in 1744, is a prayerful anticipation of Christ's arrival, invoking themes of hope, joy, and divine redemption. Ley's arrangement for choir, organ, and often congregation, is characterized by lush, flowing harmonies and a sense of reverence that is well-suited to the Advent season.

James Vivian (b. 1974) is a contemporary British composer, conductor, and organist known for his contributions to choral and sacred music. He serves as the Director of Music at St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, where he leads the world-renowned choir. Vivian's musical output is diverse, ranging from liturgical works to compositions for concert settings, often incorporating his deep understanding of choral textures and the organ. His brief yet effective postlude on today's closing hymn tune 'Helmsley' features toccata-like figuration with the tune mostly played in the pedal.

## **END OF YEAR GIVING REMINDERS**


As we approach the upcoming Advent and Christmas seasons, we know it can be a very busy time of the year so we want to provide you with a couple of important giving reminders. IRS tax regulations require that all pledge contributions and other donations to Grace must be received physically at Grace or postmarked by December 31, 2024 to be included on end of the year statements. Also, stock contributions must be received in Grace's brokerage account with Schwab by December 31, and therefore should be initiated at **least two weeks** before month-end to ensure timely processing.

If you choose to give online through Breeze or Tithely, there is an option called "cover the fees." Transaction fees are deducted from the total amount the church receives from each financial gift unless the donor elects to cover the fees. When you cover the fees, you are credited the total transaction amount (gift and fees) for tax purposes, and the church receives the intended gift amount.
