




THE COLLECT FOR PURITY

The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight~ indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.







All glory be to thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there, by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink ye all of this; for this is my Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me."

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, according to the institution of thy dearly beloved Son our Savior Jesus Christ, we, thy humble servants, do celebrate and make here before thy divine Majesty, with these thy holy gifts, which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; rendering unto thee most hearty thanks for the innumerable benefits procured unto us by the same.





All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the eucharist. Please come forward to the altar rail at the direction of the ushers. A full communion is made with the bread alone, but if you choose to receive the wine, you may either drink from the cup, or you may offer your wafer to the person holding the chalice, who will dip the bread in the wine for you.

If you prefer a blessing, please cross your arms over your chest. Gluten free wafers are available; simply ask the priest. If you do not wish to receive communion at the altar, please let an usher know, and communion can be brought to you in your pew.

Music Notes

Malcolm Archer (born 1952) is an English composer, conductor and organist. He was formerly Organist and Director of Music at Bristol Cathedral, at Wells Cathedral and at St Paul's Cathedral and Director of Chapel Music at Winchester College.

His setting on the hymn tune "Merton" starts with a four-measure introduction. The melody is then played in the top voice of a four-part texture two measures at a time with two measure interludes based on the melodic material from the introduction.

David Thorne (b. 1950) is an accomplished musician, composer, arranger and teacher whose career has included composing and arranging music for the visit of the late Archbishop Desmond Tutu and performing in the presence of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

His setting on the hymn tune "Merton" has a three-voice texture, a popular texture in organ music. The melody is played in the left hand accompanied by a lightly registered right hand and the pedal providing the bass line.

British composer, organist, and choir director **Philip Wilby** attributed his early interest in musical composition to another English composer Herbert Howells whose composition classes he attended in his youth. His later serious commitment to composition developed during his years at Oxford University where he received an undergraduate degree in composition in 1971. He joined the faculty of the University of Leeds in 1972 where he is Principal Lecturer in Composition. His stately If Ye Love Me opens with a fetching tune sung by the soprano section that is later taken up by the choir in unison. Between those two sections, Wilby features a divided soprano section in rising and falling sequences.

Rebecca Groom Te Velde (b. 1956) is an American organist, composer, and educator, known for her contributions to sacred music and her work in the field of organ performance. She holds degrees in music and has studied at institutions such as the University of Southern California and the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). Te Velde is particularly recognized for her compositions for organ and her arrangements of hymns, which are often performed in church settings.

Her setting of the hymn tune "Besançon" (today's closing hymn), uses a clever carillon figuration in the right hand with the tune found in the pedals (feet). A quieter mid-section sets the tune in the left hand with the right hand keeping the same busy rhythm as before. The last section becomes loud again, and the left hand plays opening melody from the hymn "How bright appears the morning star" usually sung for the Epiphany.

END OF YEAR GIVING REMINDERS

As we approach the upcoming Advent and Christmas seasons, we know it can be a very busy time of the year so we want to provide you with a couple of important giving reminders. IRS tax regulations require that all pledge contributions and other donations to Grace must be received physically at Grace or postmarked by December 31, 2024 to be included on end of the year statements. Also, stock contributions <u>must be received</u> in Grace's brokerage account with Schwab by December 31, and therefore should be initiated at least two weeks before month-end to ensure timely processing.

If you choose to give online through Breeze or Tithely, there is an option called "cover the fees." Transaction fees are deducted from the total amount the church receives from each financial gift unless the donor elects to cover the fees. When you cover the fees, you are credited the total transaction amount (gift and fees) for tax purposes, and the church receives the intended gift amount. 
