When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint Jesus. # SPRING ADULT FORMATION OPPORTUNITY: REFLECTING ON OUR LIVES AS PILGRIMAGES

Please join Julia McClung and Anne Boris as we gather for a six-week Adult Formation series this spring to grow and learn together, share our faith experience, and build community as we focus on the topic of viewing our faith as a pilgrimage. We're offering two formats for meeting each week: In-person at Grace Monday nights: 4/15, 4/22, 4/29, 5/6, 5/13, and 5/20; and Virtual via Zoom: Tuesday or Thursday afternoons during the same weeks as above. For the Monday evening sessions, we will open at 6:30 pm for those who want to bring their own dinner and socialize, and then engage from 7:00 pm until 8:30 pm.
