





THE SECOND LESSON 2 Corinthians 6:1-13

Lector A reading from the Second Letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

As we work together with Christ, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, "At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you."

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. 


THE GREAT THANKSGIVING: EUCHARISTIC PRAYER A




Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him.



Music Notes

Charles-Marie Widor (1844–1937) was a French composer, organist, and teacher. His legacy is closely tied to the organ, and he is best known for his ten organ symphonies. Widor held significant positions at Saint-Sulpice in Paris and the Paris Conservatory, where he influenced generations of musicians.

The *Adagio* is the fourth movement from Symphony No. 5 in F minor by the French composer Charles-Marie Widor. This lush and tender movement is part of a five-movement work. The movement that follows, colloquially known as Widor's Toccata, is perhaps the most widely performed piece for organ.

Frederick Chatfield (b. 1950), a published composer, served as Director of Music and Organist of Christ United Methodist Church in Kettering, Ohio, a position he held for thirty years (1986-2016). Fred Chatfield has arranged this haunting tune and lyrics by Jacqui Jones into an anthem "Have You Heard God's Voice?" for our time. The text talks about following the way of Christ, but it also speaks to a broader audience in these days of turmoil.

The Finale of Charles-Marie Widor's Symphony No. 2 is a powerful and energetic conclusion to the six-movement work. Marked by its fast tempo and driving rhythms, the Finale is triumphant and majestic. Widor utilizes the full resources of the organ, with forceful chords and bright fanfares showcasing the instrument's power and grandeur.
