
THE GREAT THANKSGIVING: EUCHARISTIC PRAYER A



VOLUNTARY Litanies Jehan Alain

At the end of liturgy today, one of the priests will be available at the Lady Altar for prayers for healing.

#### Music Notes

Jehan Alain (1911-1940) was a remarkable French organist, composer, and soldier. Born into a family of musicians, he inherited his love for music from his father, Albert Alain—an organist, composer, and amateur organ builder. Alain's compositions reflect a fascinating blend of influences: the earlier musical language of Claude Debussy, contemporary elements from Olivier Messiaen, an interest in far-eastern music and philosophy (acquired at the Exposition coloniale internationale), a revival of baroque styles, and even hints of jazz.

Jehan Alain's Variations sur un thème de Clément Jannequin (Variations on a Theme by Clément Jannequin) is a captivating work for organ. Composed in 1937, it showcases Alain's innovative approach to composition and his ability to blend historical influences with contemporary techniques. Alain takes a sixteenth-century chanson by Clément Jannequin as his starting point. Jannequin was a French composer known for his chansons (vocal pieces), and Alain's choice of this theme reflects his interest in historical music. The piece consists of a set of variations based on Jannequin's theme. Alain explores various textures, harmonies, and rhythmic patterns throughout the work. Each variation offers a fresh perspective on the original material. Alain doesn't merely stick to traditional variations. Instead, he employs techniques like retrograde (playing the theme backward) and inversion (playing it upside down). These elements add complexity and intrigue to the composition.

Alain composed this piece during the interwar period in France, a time of artistic experimentation and shifting musical paradigms. His ability to blend historical references with contemporary techniques exemplifies his unique voice as a composer.

Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1958) was an influential English composer who left an indelible mark on 20th-century music. Born on October 12, 1872, in Down Ampney, Gloucestershire, England, he is best known for his orchestral compositions, operas, ballets, and vocal pieces.

Taken from Psalm 34: 8, the communion anthem O taste and see was commissioned from Vaughan Williams for the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II and was first sung at Westminster Abbey on 2 June 1953 at the point in the service where the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh advanced to the steps of the altar for the administration of bread and wine. A simple, modal miniature, set in G major, the anthem is in two short parts, each headed with the innocent invocation of a haunting solo treble.

Jehan Alain's Litanies is a powerful and evocative work for solo organ, composed in 1937. Despite its brevity, it leaves a lasting impact. The work begins with a visceral theme—a solo statement—that recurs incessantly throughout. This theme takes on various guises: sometimes harmonically complex, sometimes combined with a counter-melody, but always insistent. Alain wrote the following words at the top of the piece: "When the Christian soul no longer finds new words in its distress to implore God's mercy, it repeats ceaselessly and with a vehement faith the same invocation." This inexorable theme represents the ascent of faith beyond reason. The final sonority—a poignant A-flat minor superimposed on E-flat minor—expresses intense emotion beyond the realm of words. Alain's lack of harmonic resolution captures the distress and faith that defy explanation.

#### VESTRY UPDATE FROM MARY HIX, SENIOR WARDEN

In June Mother Jenny and I joined in a Parish Conversation to give information about the ongoing discernment process. Following that meeting I followed up with a letter to the parish containing the information given at the meeting. Now, almost two months later, I write to update you about the events that have taken place since June.

In June, Bishop Stevenson met with Mother Anne and together they agreed that she would like to proceed in mutual discernment with the Grace Vestry. The discernment is to determine if the Grace Vestry or Mother Anne desire to be in a ministerial relationship again. Bishop Stevenson appointed the Rev Shirley Graham Smith to facilitate conversations between the Grace Vestry and Mother Anne.

In late June and early July, Mother Shirley, Mother Anne and I met twice. The conversations provided an opportunity to inform Mother Anne about events at Grace in the past year, and to hear about Mother Anne's journey during this time. Now the entire Grace Vestry will meet with Mother Anne in mid-August. In multiple meetings the Vestry has continued to reflect on the information gleaned from the Affinity groups and to carefully plan the upcoming conversation with Mother Anne.

Additional Vestry meetings are scheduled in August to reflect on the meeting with Mother Anne. The timetable for decision making is fluid, while the intent is to listen to the Holy Spirit's guidance about timing and outcome.

Mother Jenny's ministry at Grace will end on August 25 and we will welcome the Rev. Abbott Bailey as our Bridge Rector for six weeks beginning September 1. By the conclusion of Mother Abbott's ministry at Grace in mid-October, we hope to know if Mother Anne will be returning as rector, or if Grace will be calling an Interim Rector to serve while a search for a new rector occurs.

Please contact me or other Vestry members with your questions. Your prayers and kindness are sustaining our intent to be faithful discerners.
