


THE COLLECT FOR PURITY



THE FIRST LESSON

Lector A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah.





And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy dearly-beloved Son Jesus Christ.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies.



Music Notes

James Biery (born 1956) is an American organist, composer and conductor who is Minister of Music at Grosse Pointe Memorial Church (Presbyterian) in Grosse Pointe Farms, Michigan, where he directs the choirs, plays the 66-rank Klais organ and oversees the music program of the church.

Biery's setting on the hymn tune 'Salzburg' is surprisingly quiet given the nature of the hymn. It features a wave like figuration on top of the re-harmonized hymn tune and creates a reflective atmosphere.

The Waters of Life by James Biery is a setting of the text from the Rite of Baptism for Children is especially suitable for today's feast of the Baptism of our Lord. The accompaniment creates undulation much like water with swaying motion. The piece starts quietly and gradually grows to a fortissimo and diminishes in dynamic.

J.S. Bach's chorale arrangement of Christ unser herr zum jordan kam, BWV 684 ("Christ our Lord came to the Jordan") is brimming with cheerfulness. Luther's hymn is one with a very special promise: that of a new life. Christ was baptised in the Jordan by St John, and he baptises us to cleanse us of our sins. But the baptismal water is no ordinary water, as it is coloured with the blood of Christ. Through the water of death, the person baptised is reborn in Christ. While the chorale melody sounds in long notes in the pedal, the river water ripples gaily in fast notes over two keyboards, without being turned anywhere along the banks. In the four-voiced arrangement, there are many question and answer games between the three highest parts, which emphasize once again the carefree unity of those being purified (https://www.bachvereniging.nl)
