
HOME COMMUNION

THE SECOND LESSON

Lector A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

Priest The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it.

When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now."

Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

THE NICENE CREED


We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;



Celebrant The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the eucharist.

Fugue in F Major, BWV 540

J.S. Bach (1685-1750)

Music Notes

Samuel Coleridge-Taylor (1875–1912) was an English composer and conductor, best known for his work in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Of mixed African and English heritage, Coleridge-Taylor gained significant recognition for his symphonic and choral compositions, particularly his cantata Hiawatha's Wedding Feast (1898), inspired by Longfellow's The Song of Hiawatha. The piece garnered widespread success and made him a prominent figure in both the British classical music scene and the larger world of African heritage music. Coleridge-Taylor's music is often marked by its lush melodies, rhythmic vitality, and fusion of English classical traditions with African influences. Despite facing racial prejudice, he achieved fame internationally, with performances in the U.S. and collaborations with African American musicians. His legacy continues to inspire both classical and popular musicians today. Elegy is from a set of three short pieces and features a beautiful melody softly accompanied. It is well-suited as a remembrance piece for the observance of the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

The text to the anthem "Christ is the World's True Light" was written by George Wallace Briggs, who was born at Kirkby in Northamptonshire, England, on Dec. 14, 1875. This song is a hymn of praise to Christ as the light of the world. Stanza 1 focuses on Christ as the light. Stanza 2 focuses on Christ as the peacemaker. Stanza 3 focuses on Christ as the uniter. **W.K Stanton (1891-1978)** was an English organist, educationalist, and composer of sacred music. Stanton composed mostly choral music, including almost 50 hymn tunes and numerous choral anthems, several of which have become standard church choir fare. The Fugue in F Major, BWV 540 is the fugue pair of the Toccata and Fugue in F Major, BWV 540 written by **J.S. Bach (1685-1750)** when he was in Weimar. The Fugue is filled with chromaticism and dissonances. Two fugue subjects are exposed in separate sections and then combined in a moment of contrapuntal majesty. Notice the way the foot pedals in the depths of the organ drop out for an extended period, allowing the higher voices to meander freely, and then return with titanic power. Listen for the moment in the final bars when the opening falling chromatic fugue subject enters in the mighty bass line of the pedals. Infiltrating the DNA of the entire piece, Bach's subject is a persistent, unrelenting power which cannot be ignored. – Timothy Judd

Grace Episcopal Church will mark Inauguration Day and an intentional time of prayer on the day itself.
