



THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

THE FIRST LESSON Jeremiah 17:5-10

They shall be like a shrub in the desert, and shall not see when relief comes. They shall live in the parched places of the wilderness, in an uninhabited salt land. Blessed are those who trust in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord. They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit. If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.





Music Notes

Aaron Shows (b.1989) is a Los Angeles-based composer, organist, and pianist originally from Montgomery, Alabama. With a musical background spanning 25 years, his influences draw from many centuries and styles, from the traditional Baroque era through contemporary genres such as jazz, folk/bluegrass, rock, and also with a particular interest in the evolving forms of film and television music. His prelude on 'Jesus Shall Reign' is surprisingly calm and songlike. The piece starts with a countermelody. The hymn tune DUKE STREET is not heard until a lengthy introduction. The middle section sets the tune to a waltz and leads to the return of the introduction material, the main melody, and a brief coda.

"Jesus Christ the Apple Tree" arranged by **Alan Bullard** sets the traditional text to the traditional English folk melody "O Waly Waly" to explore the theme of Christ as the source of spiritual nourishment and eternal life. The text, taken from a 17th-century hymn, compares Jesus to the apple tree, a symbol of sweetness, sustenance, and divine love. Bullard is a British composer, known mainly for his choral and educational music. His compositions are regularly performed and broadcast worldwide, and they appear on a number of CDs.

Fela. Sowande was born in Nigeria and became a US citizen in 1977. His organ compositions show a strong Nigerian influence, as well as Western style. In the book, "Nigerian Art Music," Bode Omojola observes: "Fela Sowande is undoubtedly the father of modern Nigerian Art Music." In "Jubilate" Sowande makes use of ostinato, a persistently repeated melodic and/or rhythmic pattern, an influence from his home country.
