





#### THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

THE FIRST LESSON


Acts 11:1-18

*Lector* A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, `Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, `By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, `What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, `Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, `John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."





We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

### We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;



#### **MUSIC NOTES**

**F Valerie Stephenson** became a well-known handbell composer/arranger and instructor as a second career after having been a music teacher. In 2014, Handbell Musicians of America recognized her with an Honorary Life Membership, an award she cherished. *Just a Closer Walk* incorporates two Lenten hymns, CLOSER WALK, a traditional gospel song, and IN THE GARDEN (heard played on chimes in the middle of the piece). This piece makes use of the mallets often used to strike the bells in a different way, as a percussive element by striking the foam the bells rest on. Listen carefully as the effect is subtle.

During the Offertory, the handbells will play *Easter Rondo*. In this mash-up for Handbells, composer **Michael Helman** weaves hymn tunes Victory (The Strife is O'er), Gelobt Sei Gott (Good Christian Friends, Rejoice and Sing), as well as strains of *The Trumpet Shall Sound* from *Messiah* by G.F. Händel.

**Douglas E. Wagner**, a native of Chicago, Illinois, is an internationally recognized composer and arranger. With 30 years as a high school music educator and administrator behind him, Doug now devotes all of his time and energy to writing, editing and their allied activities. He is an A.S.C.A.P. award-winning composer, an editor for a major publishing company, and has served several denominations as a church musician. His arrangement of the tune hymn "Now the Green Blade Riseth" to the tune *Noël Nouvelet* starts with an introduction alluding to the tune. Wagner has fun with the modal harmonies underpinning the hymn tune.

**M.** Searle Wright (1918–2004) was a distinguished American organist, composer, and educator whose career spanned several decades and left a lasting impact on church music and the organ community. Today's concluding voluntary is taken from his *Fantasy*, *Fugue and Chorale on Engelberg*. The Fugue follows the traditional form but does use solo stops to bring out the melody. The Fugue climaxes into the chorale where the melody is played by a big solo reed. An exciting coda brings the piece to a rousing close.
