Prelude Prayer Joseph Jongen (1873-1953) All stand.


THE OPENING ANTHEM

THE NEW TESTAMENT READING - ROMANS VIII. 14.

Lector A reading from the book of Romans.

As many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God. For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father. The Spirit himself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God: and if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together. For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us. For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God. We know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose. What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us? He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things? Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us.

Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us. For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.



Don died at home from complications from a fall. He spent his childhood in Dickenson County, Virginia. Although the Smiths relocated to Richmond in the early 1950s, Don always called Southwest Virginia home.

After graduating from Highland Springs High School, he worked for VDOT surveying what is now Interstate 66 followed by a stint in the Virginia National Guard in 1964/'65. He attended Richmond Polytechnical Institute at night, graduating with an associate's degree in science from Virginia Commonwealth University in 1970. Don relocated to Alexandria in 1975, bringing his knowledge of construction specifications and technology to many DC area architecture firms. He used to joke that he built most of Tyson's Corners! He taught a class in construction documents at Northern Virginia Community College. He insisted that students each have a dictionary, teaching that misspelled words can cause the documents to be null and void. He retired as the Director of Technical

Services for the Assoc. of the Wall and Ceiling Industry in 2013. Don was responsible for leading AWCI's codes, standards, safety, and technical services efforts specific to the wall and ceiling construction industry. He also wrote technical oriented articles for the association and was the staff liaison and coordinated all activities of the Construction Technology Council (CTC), as well as any CTC committees, subcommittees, and task forces.

Don was a talented carpenter designing and building custom pieces and furniture for popular 18" dolls which he sold at crafts fairs. He shipped the woodworking plans nationwide in the 1990's & early 2000's sharing building tips with fellow fathers & grandfathers via a toll-free number. He cochaired the building committee of the Beverely Hills Church Pre-School playground in 1984. He was not too proud to strap a tool belt around his waist and go out as an independent "handy man" and home project manager when commercial construction experienced a down turn. With his "lending library "of tools, he was well known in his neighborhood for helping/teaching younger homeowners how to do their own home repairs.

Active with the Alexandria Jaycees, he served as president in 1977-1978. He was elected a Key Man in 1979. He played the snare drum in the Alexandria Pipes and Drums band when he first came to town. He served as team representative for the Chinquapin "Wahoos" swim team in the 1990's, and was active with Potomac Valley Swimming, helping to draft guidelines for legal starts for deaf swimmers. They were incorporated into the Official Rule Book of USA Swimming. Several deaf Olympians have benefited from these efforts. After Hurricane Isabel hit Alexandria in 2003, he was an original member of Alexandria's Certified Emergency Response Team (CERT). He was an active volunteer supporting the annual Antiques in Alexandria show helping to raise funds for TWIG, The Athenaeum, and The Alexandria Association. A passionate "HAM", he was active in the world of Amateur Radio: call sign KI4FON. Among other events, he helped to facilitate communications at the Marine Corps marathon. He designed and built antennae and radios.

He is survived by his wife of 46 years, Newbold "Newbie" Richardson, and two daughters, graduates of Grace Episcopal School: Anne "Woodie" Smith of Alexandria, Ruth Yeeling Anderson of Atlanta GA, and five grandchildren. His son, Scott, predeceased him in 2018.
